CHAPTER 1

Before You Say "Yes I do" -

The Foundation of a God-Fearing Single

The Christian Single: What Makes You Ready for Marriage?

We live in a time where the **Christian dating** scene doesn't look much different from that of the world. Swiping, shallow preferences, secret sin, vague

boundaries, and fast intimacy—it's all blended in a digital haze of confusion. Yet Scripture is clear:

"Do not be yoked together with unbelievers. For what do righteousness and wickedness have in common? Or what fellowship can light have with darkness?"

- 2 Corinthians 6:14 (NIV)

God doesn't just give rules for no reason—He gives protection. When God refers to the ungodly as "unclean" or "pagans," it's not to condemn, but to **caution**. He is a loving Father who knows what harms the soul.

Many Christian singles are **emotionally ready** for marriage but **spiritually shallow** in their understanding of God's design. As a result, they mistake chemistry for compatibility and attraction for covenant.

Why Identity Must Come Before Intimacy

God created humanity with intentional detail. Each person carries a unique DNA-physical, emotional,

spiritual. This means your needs, desires, calling, and even love language are not like anyone else's.

"I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well."

— Psalm 139:14 (NIV)

Before you seek a partner, seek to **know yourself.** Not in a self-help, social media way, but in the deep, quiet place of **self-awareness guided by the Holy Spirit.**

Ask:

- What are my non-negotiables in a relationship?
- What traumas have I not healed from?
- What is my purpose, and how would marriage help or hinder it?

Many jump into relationships needing their wounds bandaged. But marriage is not a hospital, it is a partnership of wholeness. As one counselor says, "What you don't heal in singleness, you will bleed in marriage."

Current Day Realities

Today's world teaches us that **neediness is weakness**, yet deep down, we are all created with needs, spiritual, emotional, physical. A companion, by God's design, is someone who understands and responds to those needs. But how can your partner meet what you have not yet discovered about yourself?

This is why people get into relationships **that start with excitement and end with exhaustion.** There was no real discovery, just an emotional high that faded.

"Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it." — Proverbs 4:23 (NIV)

God is not against romance. He created it. But He wants wise romance, not reckless emotion. You cannot build a godly relationship on surface-level connection. That's like building a house on sand.

"Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders labor in vain." — Psalm 127:1 (NIV)

Prune your heart

Refine your desires

Reveal your identity

Prepare your character

You don't attract what you want, you attract who you are. And if you want a godly partner, you must become one.

CHAPTER 2

Finding a Companion, Choosing a Godly Marriage Partner

Theme Scripture: Amos 3:3

"Do two walk together, unless they have agreed to meet?"

This foundational scripture reveals a profound truth: true partnership requires agreement, unity, and divine alignment. A marriage without agreement in values, vision, and purpose becomes a battlefield instead of a blessing.

1. The Foundation: Obedience to God in Choosing a Partner

Before you even consider *who* to marry, it's important to understand *how* to approach this sacred choice:

1 Corinthians 15:33 (ESV): "Do not be deceived: 'Bad company ruins good morals."

Proverbs 13:20 (NIV): "Walk with the wise and become wise, for a companion of fools suffers harm."

Obedience to God brings clarity, safety, and blessings When we obey His principles:

- We avoid unnecessary heartbreak.
- We walk in His timing and grace.
- We attract partners aligned with our spiritual path.

2. The Non-Negotiables for a Christian

Amos 3:3: Can two walk together unless they be agreed?

Key Principles:

1. Christians marry Christians

- This is not just preference; it's protection.
- 2 Corinthians 6:14: "Do not be unequally yoked with unbelievers..."

2. Don't choose based on familiarity alone (tribe, church, culture, etc.)

- Familiarity isn't divine confirmation.
- Seek divine alignment over cultural convenience.

3. Clarity of Purpose

Know your purpose before picking your partner.
 You need someone who can walk with you in your assignment.

4. Work on yourself first

• Be an eagle before expecting to marry one. *Birds of a feather flock together*.

5. Faith over fear

 Even if the unexpected happens (e.g., she walks out), your trust must be in God, not the outcome.

Ecclesiastes 4:9-10: "Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor. If either of them falls down, one can help the other up."

3. What to Look For in a Marriage Partner

1. Fear of the Lord

Proverbs 31:30: "Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting; but a woman who fears the Lord is to be praised."

The fear of God is the anchor of integrity, humility, and commitment.

2. Wisdom and Discernment

Proverbs 3:13: "Blessed are those who find wisdom, those who gain understanding."

Wisdom isn't just intellect; it's spiritual maturity, knowing when and how to act righteously.

3. Discretion

Ability to say the right thing, at the right time, for the right reasons.

4. True Character Over Charm

Matthew 23:26-28: Jesus warns about **external** beauty without internal purity.

What matters is not just how they look, but **who** they are when no one is watching.

4. Advantages of Obeying God's Design for Marriage

- Peace of Mind
- Protection from abusive or toxic partners
- Godly legacy for your children
- Answered prayers and favor (Psalm 84:11)
- Shared destiny and purpose

Malachi 2:15: "Has not the one God made you? You belong to him in body and spirit. And what does the one God seek? Godly offspring."

5. Christian Unity: Beyond the Walls of Denomination Galatians 3:28: "There is neither Jew nor Gentile... for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

Don't discriminate based on the church someone attends, but look for their fruits in Christ. Your single agenda should always align with God's eternal agenda.

- 6. How Not to Choose a Partner: Red Flags Signs to Avoid:
 - 1. A sense of slavery or servitude in the relationship

Galatians 5:1: "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free... do not be burdened again by a yoke of slavery."

If one party is manipulating or demanding service in courtship, it's a trap for future bondage.

2. Flattery and fake service

- Don't serve just to win someone.
- Wait until there's clear direction and commitment before engaging in deep acts of service.

3. Bitterness and unforgiveness

Ephesians 4:31-32: "Get rid of all bitterness... Be kind and compassionate... forgiving each other." Someone who cannot forgive will build emotional prison walls in marriage.

4. Lack of accountability or spiritual guidance

- Don't make such a lifelong decision alone.
- Involve wise counselors and spiritual oversight.

7. Key Qualities to Seek in a Godly Spouse Spiritual Traits:

- Fear of God
- Integrity
- Consistency
- Commitment
- Teachability

Relational Traits:

- Gentleness (*Proverbs 15:1*)
- Patience (*v.* 18)
- Good communication (v. 23)
- Respect and humility
- Honoring family values
- Willingness to grow

Deal Breakers:

- Disrespect
- Pride
- Emotional manipulation
- Self-centeredness
- Living a double life

8. The Beauty of Walking with the Right Person

When you marry right:

- You build a legacy.
- You multiply impact.
- You face storms together and come out stronger.
- Your marriage becomes a **testimony**, not just a testimony of love, but of **God's divine wisdom**.

Proverbs 18:22: "He who finds a wife finds a good thing and obtains favor from the Lord."

Final Words: Let God Choose for You

Marriage is not a sprint. It's a journey, and journeys are best taken with the right companion. Wait on God, obey His Word, surround yourself with wise counsel, and choose purposefully.
